



Delight in the roots of Americana with a musical tour of The Heartland focusing on rock 'n' roll, country music, and faith-based entertainment and attractions.

DAY 1: FLY TO SPRINGFIELD

Today, arrive in Springfield, Missouri, the "Birthplace of Route 66." We check-in to our hotel and start to get in the spirit of the Mid-South.

DAY 2: BRANSON

After breakfast, we depart for Branson, beginning the morning with a tour of the College of the Ozarks where you'll get a sense of its unique intersection between faith and the liberal arts that permeates this part of the country. Appreciate the beauty of the campus including its towering chapel and quaint walkways. Dubbed "Hard Work U" by The Wall Street Journal, students work for their tuition and are not allowed to take out loans for their education. Enjoy lunch on your own at Branson Landing, choosing from a wide selection of restaurants while strolling its scenic boardwalk along Lake Taneycomo. In the evening, we start our musical adventures with a Holiday Vacations Welcome Dinner four-course Southern feast followed by Dolly Parton's Stampede, an exciting vari-

ety show featuring music, live animals, comedy, and pyrotechnics. **B,D**

DAY 3: HEARTLAND ENTERTAINMENT

You have the morning and midafternoon to yourself to explore Branson or relax. Visit the Titanic Museum which has the largest collection of artifacts from the original ship, marvel at the massive Shepard of the Hills Fish Hatchery where over 350,000 pounds of brown and rainbow trout are raised annually, or get lost in nostalgia at the World's Largest Toy Museum. To get a flavor of the city's famous family-vacation destination reputation, pack your morning with a trip to Silver Dollar City. We'll continue entertainment into the evening with a George Strait "King of Country" tribute show. **B,D**

DAY 4: MEMPHIS

Today, say goodbye to Branson as we make our way through the heartland on a drive to Memphis where we'll stay for two nights. Upon arrival, we visit the Rock 'n' Soul Museum before checking-in to our hotel.

Spend the night relaxing and resting up for an active day to follow. **B**

DAY 5: GRACELAND

Get ready to explore home of "the King" himself, Elvis Presley. Graceland is considered the birthplace of Rock 'n' Roll for this reason. We take a Graceland tour that will tickle your imagination as you consider how Elvis purchased the 10,266-square-foot mansion on the 14-acre property when he was only 22 years old. There is also a museum and exhibition center where you can see his famed jumpsuits, film memorabilia, platinum and gold records, and interactive exhibits. Enjoy lunch on your own before we embark on a Memphis city tour. The evening will be yours to explore or relax. **B**

DAY 6: ARRIVE IN NASHVILLE

Before we head to Nashville, we pay a visit to one more site in Memphis, the National Civil Rights Museum, where we'll learn about and reflect on the history of civil rights in our country. The exhibits trace a comprehensive history of the American

Civil Rights Movement from the 17th century to present. Once the Lorraine Motel, the museum site is precisely where Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated in 1968 after giving his powerfully faithful and controversial "I've Been to the Mountaintop" speech. After, we head out to Nashville, stopping for a lunch break on your own in Jackson, the city made famous by the Johnny Cash and June Carter country hit single. When we arrive in Nashville, we'll visit Loretta Lynn's Ranch for a down-home country welcome before going to our hotel for the evening. At the ranch, experience "Western Town" which sits upon the historic Grist Mill waterfall. Here, you may explore the various museums and gift shops while also soaking up the classic country vibes on a massive deck overlooking the waterfall and Hurricane Creek. **B**

DAY 7: COUNTRY MUSIC HALL OF FAME

Start the day with a savory breakfast before we go on a Nashville city tour followed by an included lunch. After, we visit the Country Music Hall of

Fame where we celebrate the rich musical genre with digital archives and collections including Bob Pinson Recorded Sound, Photograph, Oral History, Moving Image, and Objects. The collections contain 98% of all pre-WWII country recordings and hundreds of interviews with songwriters, recording artists, and performers as well as stage costumes, microphones, and much more that documents and honors the history of country music. Later, enjoy free time and dinner on your own, perhaps venturing out to experience some Nashville local favorites like its famed hot chicken, fried catfish, and regionally-specific style of barbecue. **B,L**

DAY 8: RYMAN AUDITORIUM

For our last morning in Music City, we begin at the historic Belle Meade Plantation and cast our minds back to a time when this Greek Revival style mansion existed on an operational plantation prior to the Civil War. The Harding family who ran the plantation had 136 slaves. After the war, some previously enslaved families remained working for the Harding family while others used

their new freedom to find their own homes around Nashville. We stop for lunch at Merchants Restaurant before kicking off this evening's night of entertainment with a tour of the historic Ryman Auditorium. Dating back to the 1800s, the Ryman was originally a Union Gospel Tabernacle before the 1920s when it was leased as an entertainment venue, hosting acts such as Charlie Chaplin and Katharine Hepburn. Finally, the Grand Ole Opry put roots down at the Ryman in 1943 when live TV and radio was sweeping the country with unforgettable new sounds and styles from Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, and many others. In this spirit, we conclude the evening with a farewell dinner and live show at the Nashville Nightlife Dinner Theater. **B,L,D**

DAY 9: FLY HOME


Arrive home with whimsical memories of our time in the heartland. **B**



Guaranteed Prices

Holiday Vacations' published tour prices are based on the rates known at the time of publication and are expected to be in effect at the time of departure. Once we have received your deposit, your price is guaranteed and any subsequent price increase is at our expense.

Reservations

Make reservations well in advance. Space requested by phone will be held for five business days pending receipt of the required deposit by mail, telephone or in person. Reservations made after the indicated final payment due date must be paid in full at the time of reservation.

\$200 Deposit Per Person

A deposit must accompany all reservation requests. Personal check, money order, Discover, MasterCard or VISA are acceptable forms of payment.

Final Payment

A balance due date and amount will be indicated on your tour statement. We accept credit cards but appreciate final payments to be made by check or money order.

Refunds

Deposits and all payments are fully refundable prior to the final payment due date. Holiday Vacations issues refunds via the payment method they were provided. (e.g., payments provided by check will be refunded with a check; payments provided by credit card will be refunded to that credit card.)

Special Requests

Individual requests must be made when booking. Requests for (non) smoking, special dietary needs, adjoining, handicap accessible or other room types are subject to confirmation and cannot be guaranteed.

Hazardous Materials

Federal law forbids the carriage of hazardous materials aboard aircraft in your luggage or on your person. A violation can result in five years imprisonment and penalties of \$250,000 or more (49 U.S.C. 5124). Hazardous materials include explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives and radioactive materials. Examples: Paints, lighter fluid, fireworks, tear gases, oxygen bottles, and radio-pharmaceuticals. There are special exceptions for small quantities (up to 70 ounces total) of medicinal and toiletry articles carried in your luggage and certain smoking materials carried on your person. Persons Needing Special Assistance

Holiday Vacations does not provide personal attendant services. Any disability requiring special attention should be reported to us at the time you make your reservation. We will make reasonable attempts to accommodate special needs, but we are not responsible for any denial of services by carriers, hotels, restaurants, and other independent suppliers. Travelers requiring assistance must be accompanied by a companion who is capable of and totally responsible for providing the necessary assistance.

Children On Tour

Children traveling on tour must be at least eight years old and accompanied by an adult.

Reservation Changes

or extended hotel stays or for other eligible components of the tour should be made prior to the final payment date. A non-refundable processing fee of \$50 per person will apply for any change requested prior to the final payment date and \$100 per person for any change requested on or after the final payment date. These fees are in addition to any costs or penalties from suppliers.

Gratuities

Tips for all the included features of your tour (baggage handling, included meals, etc.) will be taken care of by your Tour Director. Tips for meals on your own or for other services are at your discretion. Customary tips for the Tour Director & Driver are on a voluntary basis and given individually. Gratuity guidelines will be provided with your tour documents.

Activity Level

To help evaluate if a tour is right for you, Holiday Vacations has designed a rating system that identifies a tour's average activity level.

Activity levels have five ranks ranging from "Relaxing" to "Active". On a tour rated "Relaxing," expect to climb some stairs, navigate slight slopes, stand for reasonable periods of time, and walk over relatively level conditions. On a tour rated "Active", expect a high activity level with challenging conditions, lots of walking, uneven surfaces, and possibly high altitudes.



Holiday Vacations guests must be able to navigate airports with their own luggage. Airport personnel can provide wheelchair assistance upon request. Guests must also be able to handle their own carry-on bags on airplanes, on and off motorcoaches, and to and from hotel rooms. Checked luggage will be delivered to and from guests' hotel rooms on their behalf.

If a guest requires mobility assistance, they must be accompanied by an able companion who is totally responsible for providing the guest's necessary assistance. Holiday Vacations does not provide personal attendant services.

All activity level ratings are relative to each guest's individual levels of fitness and mobility. Holiday Vacations is unable to determine your travel health and fitness level. Please consult your doctor when evaluating your ability to travel.

Insurance

Holiday Vacations recognizes the value and importance of travel insurance for our customers. We offer an optional Travel Protection Plan, which helps provide coverage for Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. An insurance brochure will be mailed with your first statement or may be requested in advance. If you would like to purchase the insurance, please contact Holiday Vacations. Processing fees for a voluntary change in airport departure or for other requested changes are not covered by this type of insurance. Solo Travelers

Holiday Vacations welcomes solo travelers. We will try to assist in arranging a roommate for any person wishing to share accommodations at the double occupancy tour rate. Should a shared arrangement not be available, the single price applies.

Triple & Quad

These accommodations are usually in rooms with two double beds. A rollaway bed or cot is subject to availability on a request basis.

Real ID Domestic Tours: Effective for all domestic flights with a start or finish after **October 1, 2021**, all passengers 18 years of age and older must carry a **REAL ID** compliant driver's license or another federally approved ID such as a Passport, active Military ID or Global Entry card.

Passport Required (FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL) Your Passport must be valid for **6 months** from the end date of your tour. It is Holiday Vacations' policy that all tours traveling outside of the United States require a valid U.S. Passport in the form of a Passport book. Passport cards are not advised for any Holiday Vacations tour traveling outside of the United States.

Travel to Canada

Even with a required Passport, Canada considers people with certain criminal records as inadmissible. Canada classifies DWI's, DUI's and OWI's as felonies and considers a person inadmissible if they have one of these in the past 10-15 years on their record. Checked Luggage

Carry-On Bags

In addition to your suitcase, each person is allowed one soft sided carry-on, intended for items you need on a daily basis. We recommend a small day bag, such as a soft-sided backpack. To avoid any charges, the carry-on must fit into the overhead bins of a motorcoach (smaller than airplane overhead bins). You may also bring one personal item, such as a camera bag, briefcase or purse. Carry-ons are your responsibility to handle and cannot be stored under the motorcoach.

Additional pieces of luggage will be handled for you at hotels at \$6 per bag, per day or at the cost specified for certain tours. Though every effort will be made to safeguard your baggage, Holiday Vacations accepts no liability for loss or damage.
