



DAY 1: FLY TO ALASKA

Travel to Anchorage, the metropolis in the wilderness, and check-in to our overnight accommodations.

DAY 2: TURNAGAIN ARM

Appreciate the wilderness with intimate views of the Chugach Mountains and Cook Inlet. Marvel at snow-capped peaks and hanging glaciers while on the lookout for eagles, moose, and Dall sheep. Learn about Turnagain Arm's fascinating bore tide and love the views at Bird Point. Meet Alaska's incredible and varied animals at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center

before enjoying sweeping views from the tram followed by lunch at the Alyeska Resort in Girdwood. Spend the rest of the day in Anchorage as you please with various museums, attractions, and the city to enjoy. **L**

DAY 3: PRINCE WILLIAM SOUND

Witness state-of-the-art exhibits that capture Alaska's natural wonder using artful lighting and sound at Begich Boggs Visitor Center located in the scenic Portage Valley. Our adventure continues with a Glacier & Wildlife Cruise on Prince William Sound.

Our narrated cruise offers a chance to see the wildlife that makes the sound its home. See Meares Glacier, an advancing tidewater glacier, located in the Chugach National Forest. Whales, sea otters, Dall's porpoise, and sea birds are often seen while cruising the waters of Prince William Sound. Later, we arrive in Valdez for two nights. **B,D**

DAY 4: ALASKAN SCENERY

Marvel at spectacular waterfalls and steep canyon walls as you hear the story of a fight for control of Keystone Canyon as we make our

way to Thompson Pass for views of Worthington Glacier. The remainder of the day is at leisure. Optional activities today in Valdez include visits to the Whitney and Valdez Museums, the Solomon Gulch Fish Hatchery as well as flightseeing, kayaking, hiking, and fishing. **B**

DAY 5: THE BOLD NORTH

Spectacular mountain views abound as we travel along the Richardson Highway, Alaska's first road. Catch glimpses of the Trans-Alaska Oil Pipeline along the way. Later we stop at the Santa Claus House before arriving in Fairbanks for a two-night stay. **B,D**

DAY 6: GOLD PANNING & STERNWHEELER CRUISE

We'll visit historic Gold Dredge 8 to learn about old gold mining methods and pan for gold ourselves! After lunch at Discovery Landing, we board the Riverboat *Discovery III* for a narrated cruise. Aboard this stern-wheeler, learn about life in Alaska's Interior along the Chena River. Witness bush plane and sled dog demonstrations. Then, we'll go ashore to view the recreated Athabascan settlement, learning about indigenous shelter and clothes. **B,L**

DAY 7: DENALI NATIONAL PARK & PRESERVE

We travel to Denali where our adventure begins in Denali National Park, a six million acre wilderness. During our Tundra Wilderness Tour we will cross from the boreal forest onto the tundra; our driver guide provides commentary and insights into this rare ecosystem. Watch for bears, moose, caribou and Dall sheep while we also hope to spy majestic Denali, the tallest mountain in North America. Our accommodations for the evening are in the Denali area. **B,L**

DAY 8: JET BOAT ADVENTURE

Feel the power of the glacially fed Susitna River as our jetboat driver navigates these turbulent waters into the wilderness. We step ashore to visit a Dena'ina Native Encampment and authentic trapper's cabin. Our guide introduces us to wildflowers and plants once used for medicinal purposes. While back on the boat, we'll look for views of Denali as we return to Talkeetna for the night. **B**

DAY 9: IDITAROD TRAIL HQ

Enjoy a leisurely start to day before we head out for the day, making our way back to Anchorage. Our lunch at Settler's Bay Lodge affords breathtaking views of the Chugach

Mountains. We visit the Iditarod Trail Headquarters where we learn about the iconic dogsled race from Anchorage to Nome. We'll view an authentic checkpoint cabin and get a chance to explore. We return to Anchorage for our last overnight. **B,L**

DAY 10: CULTURE & CELEBRATIONS

Take time this morning to relax and reflect on the week's adventures before our special Holiday Vacations Farewell Lunch where you can share memories with your fellow travelers and new friends. This afternoon, visit the Anchorage Museum with displays of history, art, ecology, science, and ethnography. Continue with a visit to the Alaska Native Heritage Center to learn about Alaska's indigenous peoples including housing, lifestyles, language, song, and dance. This evening we board our overnight flight back home. **L**

DAY 11: ARRIVE HOME

Travel home with unforgettable memories of our Alaskan adventure.

Guaranteed Prices

Reservations

Make reservations well in advance. Space requested by phone will be held for five business days pending receipt of the required deposit by mail, telephone or in person. Reservations made after the indicated final payment due date must be paid in full at the time of reservation.

\$200 Deposit Per Person

A deposit must accompany all reservation requests. Personal check, money order, Discover, MasterCard or VISA are acceptable forms of payment.

Final Payment

A balance due date and amount will be indicated on your tour statement. We accept credit cards but appreciate final payments to be made by check or money order.

Refunds

Deposits and all payments are fully refundable prior to the final payment due date. Holiday Vacations issues refunds via the payment method they were provided. (e.g., payments provided by check will be refunded with a check; payments provided by credit card will be refunded to that credit card.)

Special Requests

Individual requests must be made when booking. Requests for (non) smoking, special dietary needs, adjoining, handicap accessible or other room types are subject to confirmation and cannot be guaranteed.

Hazardous Materials

Federal law forbids the carriage of hazardous materials aboard aircraft in your luggage or on your person. A violation can result in five years imprisonment and penalties of \$250,000 or more (49 U.S.C. 5124). Hazardous materials include explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives and radioactive materials. Examples: Paints, lighter fluid, fireworks, tear gases, oxygen bottles, and radio-pharmaceuticals. There are special exceptions for small quantities (up to 70 ounces total) of medicinal and toiletry articles carried in your luggage and certain smoking materials carried on your person. Persons Needing Special Assistance

Holiday Vacations does not provide personal attendant services. Any disability requiring special attention should be reported to us at the time you make your reservation. We will make reasonable attempts to accommodate special needs, but we are not responsible for any denial of services by carriers, hotels, restaurants, and other independent suppliers. Travelers requiring assistance must be accompanied by a companion who is capable of and totally responsible for providing the necessary assistance.

Children On Tour

Children traveling on tour must be at least eight years old and accompanied by an adult.

Reservation Changes

or extended hotel stays or for other eligible components of the tour should be made prior to the final payment date. A non-refundable processing fee of \$50 per person will apply for any change requested prior to the final payment date and \$100 per person for any change requested on or after the final payment date. These fees are in addition to any costs or penalties from suppliers.

Gratuities

Tips for all the included features of your tour (baggage handling, included meals, etc.) will be taken care of by your Tour Director. Tips for meals on your own or for other services are at your discretion. Customary tips for the Tour Director & Driver are on a voluntary basis and given individually. Gratuity guidelines will be provided with your tour documents.

Activity Level

To help evaluate if a tour is right for you, Holiday Vacations has designed a rating system that identifies a tour's average activity level.

Activity levels have five ranks ranging from "Relaxing" to "Active". On a tour rated "Relaxing," expect to climb some stairs, navigate slight slopes, stand for reasonable periods of time, and walk over relatively level conditions. On a tour rated "Active", expect a high activity level with challenging conditions, lots of walking, uneven surfaces, and possibly high altitudes.



Holiday Vacations guests must be able to navigate airports with their own luggage. Airport personnel can provide wheelchair assistance upon request. Guests must also be able to handle their own carry-on bags on airplanes, on and off motorcoaches, and to and from hotel rooms. Checked luggage will be delivered to and from guests' hotel rooms on their behalf.

If a guest requires mobility assistance, they must be accompanied by an able companion who is totally responsible for providing the guest's necessary assistance. Holiday Vacations does not provide personal attendant services.

All activity level ratings are relative to each guest's individual levels of fitness and mobility. Holiday Vacations is unable to determine your travel health and fitness level. Please consult your doctor when evaluating your ability to travel.

Insurance

Holiday Vacations recognizes the value and importance of travel insurance for our customers. We offer an optional Travel Protection Plan, which helps provide coverage for Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. Processing fees for a voluntary change in airport departure or for other requested changes are not covered by this type of insurance. Solo Travelers

Holiday Vacations welcomes solo travelers. We will try to assist in arranging a roommate for any person wishing to share accommodations at the double occupancy tour rate. Should a shared arrangement not be available, the single price applies.

Triple & Quad

These accommodations are usually in rooms with two double beds. A rollaway bed or cot is subject to availability on a request basis.

Real ID Domestic Tours: Effective for all domestic flights with a start or finish after **October 1, 2021**, all passengers 18 years of age and older must carry a **REAL ID** compliant driver's license or another federally approved ID such as a Passport, active Military ID or Global Entry card.

Passport Required (FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL) Your Passport must be valid for **6 months** from the end date of your tour. It is Holiday Vacations' policy that all tours traveling outside of the United States require a valid U.S. Passport in the form of a Passport book. Passport cards are not advised for any Holiday Vacations tour traveling outside of the United States.

Travel to Canada

Even with a required Passport, Canada considers people with certain criminal records as inadmissible. Canada classifies DWI's, DUI's and OWI's as felonies and considers a person inadmissible if they have one of these in the past 10-15 years on their record. Carry-On Bags

Additional pieces of luggage will be handled for you at hotels at \$6 per bag, per day or at the cost specified for certain tours. Though every effort will be made to safeguard your baggage, Holiday Vacations accepts no liability for loss or damage.

This wilderness excursion brings us to phenomenal vantage points for viewing Denali and the Alaska Range. Watch for bald eagles and go ashore to be acquainted with Alaska's plants and wildflowers on a leisurely nature walk.

Explore authentic life-sized Native dwellings and talk with cultural representatives to learn about the traditional lifestyles of some of Alaska's major cultural groups.
