


San Francisco City Tour

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA HIGHLIGHTS

Experience monumental Yosemite National Park, a leisurely ride on the Napa Valley Wine Train, and city sights in Sacramento and San Francisco.

DAY 1: FLY TO CALIFORNIA

We begin our adventure with a flight to the City by the Bay and transfer to our deluxe accommodations for two nights.

DAY 2: SAN FRANCISCO

This morning we board San Francisco's iconic cable cars and ride along downtown's fascinating streets. After, a local expert joins us for a driving tour of the city where we see top high-

lights including Twin Peaks, Market Street, Golden Gate Park, and much more! We break for lunch and leisure time at Fisherman's Wharf, a historic bayside district with plenty of restaurants, shops, and sea lions sunning themselves. There's time to freshen up at our hotel before crossing the Golden Gate Bridge and getting to know our traveling companions at a Holiday Vacations Welcome Dinner in nearby Sausalito. **D**

DAY 3: NAPA VALLEY WINE TRAIN

This morning we travel to the heart of one of the most celebrated wine-growing regions in the world, Napa Valley. Upon arrival, board the elegantly restored Napa Valley Wine Train where a gourmet lunch and wine tasting awaits. Our journey includes scenic vineyards, wineries, homes, and gorgeous valley landscapes. This afternoon we tour an

organic olive oil farm, see their mill, and experience a tasting of their award-winning oils and balsamic vinegars. This evening we arrive at our hotel in the capital city of Sacramento for a two-night stay. **L**

DAY 4: SACRAMENTO

This morning we explore America's Farm to Fork capital city with a step-on guide. During our tour we visit California's capitol building and learn about Sacramento's fascinating gold rush history. Afterwards, we take time to stroll the boardwalk-lined street of the Old Sacramento district. Visit the specialty shops and see iconic landmarks including the Pony Express Monument and the Delta King Steamboat, now a permanently moored hotel and restaurant. Next, learn about the 150-year history of rail's impact on the Golden State at the California State Railroad Museum, seeing original engines dating back to the 1860s. This evening we partake on a local food tour. We will visit various restaurants and meet chefs who will teach us about the local "Farm to Fork" culture of Sacramento while enjoying a selection of delicious dishes. **B,D**

DAY 5: MARIPOSA

We gain a sense of the Old West as we make our way to Mariposa, just outside Yosemite National Park. Take a surface tour of the Kennedy Gold

Mine, one of the deepest mines in the world and among the most iconic mines of the California Gold Rush. We'll learn about the miner's way of life and learn how to pan for gold! Later we enjoy lunch on our own in the town of Jackson, whose charming Main Street is packed with antique shops and boutiques. We arrive at our accommodations in Mariposa in the mid-afternoon where we will stay for the next two nights. Located in the heart of California, Spanish missionaries named the town after their word for "butterfly" for the swarm of monarch butterflies passing through the area during the winter months. **B**

DAY 6: YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK

This morning we drive through the scenic protected lands of Yosemite National Park. At Mariposa Grove, there is time to take in a delightful morning hike through the Giant Sequoias. These trees can live to be more than 2,000 years old and grow to more than 300 feet in height! We continue our drive to Yosemite Valley Lodge and tour the astonishing wilderness that surrounds us on the Yosemite Valley Tram, an open-air sightseeing experience led by a Park Ranger. View some of Yosemite's most famous landmarks including Yosemite Falls, Half Dome, and El

Capitan. Late afternoon, explore Yosemite on your own. Browse the Ansel Adams Gallery's collection of famous nature photography, take a walk along a beautiful nature trail, visit the park store, or watch a short film at the onsite theater. We return to Mariposa for our second of two nights. **B**

DAY 7: ROARING CAMP RAILROAD

We depart our hotel this morning, heading west toward San Francisco. We stop at the charming roadside resort of Casa De Fruta, featuring a restaurant, deli, farmers market, wine shop, gift shop, park, and more. This afternoon we arrive at the Roaring Camp Railroad Station for a round-trip rail journey through towering groves of Redwood. While similar in their tremendous size, Redwoods tend to be taller than Sequoias, although their cones are smaller and the color of their bark is darker. We return to the San Francisco area with time to unwind before we celebrate our adventure with our new friends at a Holiday Vacations Farewell Dinner. **B,D**

DAY 8: FLY HOME

We fly home with special memories of our time in California.



General Information

Guaranteed Prices

Holiday Vacations' published tour prices are based on the rates known at the time of publication and are expected to be in effect at the time of departure. Once we have received your deposit, your price is guaranteed and any subsequent price increase is at our expense.

Reservations

Make reservations well in advance. Space requested by phone will be held for five business days pending receipt of the required deposit by mail, telephone or in person. Reservations made after the indicated final payment due date must be paid in full at the time of reservation.

\$200 Deposit Per Person

A deposit must accompany all reservation requests. Personal check, money order, Discover, MasterCard or VISA are acceptable forms of payment.

Final Payment

A balance due date and amount will be indicated on your tour statement. We accept credit cards but appreciate final payments to be made by check or money order.

Refunds

Deposits and all payments are fully refundable prior to the final payment due date. Holiday Vacations issues refunds via the payment method they were provided. (e.g., payments provided by check will be refunded with a check; payments provided by credit card will be refunded to that credit card.)

Special Requests

Individual requests must be made when booking. Requests for (non) smoking, special dietary needs, adjoining, handicap accessible or other room types are subject to confirmation and cannot be guaranteed.

Hazardous Materials

Federal law forbids the carriage of hazardous materials aboard aircraft in your luggage or on your person. A violation can result in five years imprisonment and penalties of \$250,000 or more (49 U.S.C. 5124). Hazardous materials include explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives and radioactive materials. Examples: Paints, lighter fluid, fireworks, tear gases, oxygen bottles, and radio-pharmaceuticals. There are special exceptions for small quantities (up to 70 ounces total) of medicinal and toiletry articles carried in your luggage and certain smoking materials carried on your person. Persons Needing Special Assistance

Holiday Vacations does not provide personal attendant services. Any disability requiring special attention should be reported to us at the time you make your reservation. We will make reasonable attempts to accommodate special needs, but we are not responsible for any denial of services by carriers, hotels, restaurants, and other independent suppliers. Travelers requiring assistance must be accompanied by a companion who is capable of and totally responsible for providing the necessary assistance.

Children On Tour

Children traveling on tour must be at least eight years old and accompanied by an adult.

Reservation Changes

or extended hotel stays or for other eligible components of the tour should be made prior to the final payment date. A non-refundable processing fee of \$50 per person will apply for any change requested prior to the final payment date and \$100 per person for any change requested on or after the final payment date. These fees are in addition to any costs or penalties from suppliers.

Gratuities

Tips for all the included features of your tour (baggage handling, included meals, etc.) will be taken care of by your Tour Director. Tips for meals on your own or for other services are at your discretion. Customary tips for the Tour Director & Driver are on a voluntary basis and given individually. Gratuity guidelines will be provided with your tour documents.

Activity Level

To help evaluate if a tour is right for you, Holiday Vacations has designed a rating system that identifies a tour's average activity level.

Activity levels have five ranks ranging from "Relaxing" to "Active". On a tour rated "Relaxing," expect to climb some stairs, navigate slight slopes, stand for reasonable periods of time, and walk over relatively level conditions. On a tour rated "Active", expect a high activity level with challenging conditions, lots of walking, uneven surfaces, and possibly high altitudes.



Holiday Vacations guests must be able to navigate airports with their own luggage. Airport personnel can provide wheelchair assistance upon request. Guests must also be able to handle their own carry-on bags on airplanes, on and off motorcoaches, and to and from hotel rooms. Checked luggage will be delivered to and from guests' hotel rooms on their behalf.

If a guest requires mobility assistance, they must be accompanied by an able companion who is totally responsible for providing the guest's necessary assistance. Holiday Vacations does not provide personal attendant services.

All activity level ratings are relative to each guest's individual levels of fitness and mobility. Holiday Vacations is unable to determine your travel health and fitness level. Please consult your doctor when evaluating your ability to travel.

Insurance

Holiday Vacations recognizes the value and importance of travel insurance for our customers. We offer an optional Travel Protection Plan, which helps provide coverage for Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation/Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay and more. An insurance brochure will be mailed with your first statement or may be requested in advance. If you would like to purchase the insurance, please contact Holiday Vacations. Processing fees for a voluntary change in airport departure or for other requested changes are not covered by this type of insurance. Please Note: Insurance must be purchased on or before your final payment due date. Solo Travelers

Holiday Vacations welcomes solo travelers. We will try to assist in arranging a roommate for any person wishing to share accommodations at the double occupancy tour rate. Should a shared arrangement not be available, the single price applies.

Triple & Quad

These accommodations are usually in rooms with two double beds. A rollaway bed or cot is subject to availability on a request basis.

Real ID Domestic Tours: Effective for all domestic flights with a start or finish after **October 1, 2021**, all passengers 18 years of age and older must carry a **REAL ID** compliant driver's license or another federally approved ID such as a Passport, active Military ID or Global Entry card.

Passport Required (FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL) Your Passport must be valid for **6 months** from the end date of your tour. It is Holiday Vacations' policy that all tours traveling outside of the United States require a valid U.S. Passport in the form of a Passport book. Passport cards are not advised for any Holiday Vacations tour traveling outside of the United States.

Travel to Canada

Even with a required Passport, Canada considers people with certain criminal records as inadmissible. Canada classifies DWI's, DUI's and OWI's as felonies and considers a person inadmissible if they have one of these in the past 10-15 years on their record. Other offenses such as multiple DUIs, theft or assault can bar entry even if committed decades ago. More information can be found at www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca or through your lawyer. Holiday Vacations does not accept any responsibility and travel insurance will not cover losses or expenses due to inadmissibility or an individual's legal status.

Tour Documents

Tour packets will be mailed at least ten days before your tour departure date. This material includes tour pickup location and time, a tour itinerary, hotel list and luggage tag.

Train Routes & Schedules

Please note that train schedules and/or routes are subject to change by railroad passenger services. No liability shall be incurred by Holiday Vacations for subsequent changes to train schedules and/or routes.

Cruise Line Charges

Additional fees applied by the cruise lines are not included in your tour price. These fees include but are not limited to: daily service charge for cabin & wait staff, specialty restaurant cover charges and optional shore excursions.

Checked Luggage

Each guest is allowed one suitcase which will be handled for you at hotels. The cost of checking luggage with the airlines is the responsibility of each guest (charged by and paid directly to the airlines). An excess fee or handling charge may be collected by the airlines for each piece over the designated size (length+width+height=62") and weight (50 lbs).



Carry-On Bags

In addition to your suitcase, each person is allowed one soft sided carry-on, intended for items you need on a daily basis. We recommend a small day bag, such as a soft-sided backpack. To avoid any charges, the carry-on must fit into the overhead bins of a motorcoach (smaller than airplane overhead bins). You may also bring one personal item, such as a camera bag, briefcase or purse. Carry-ons are your responsibility to handle and cannot be stored under the motorcoach.

Additional pieces of luggage will be handled for you at hotels at \$6 per bag, per day or at the cost specified for certain tours. Though every effort will be made to safeguard your baggage, Holiday Vacations accepts no liability for loss or damage.

Insecticide Use On Aircraft

Sacramento Sites, Gold Rush Riches & Riveting Railroads




Sacramento City Tour

Roaring Camp Railroad

Board a 19th century train for a relaxing round-trip on narrow gauge tracks. Travel through groves of Redwoods, ascending to the summit of Bear Mountain. Conductors will share the history of the railroad and the spellbinding wilderness that surrounds. Riding on this relic, you'll also learn about its connection to the Santa Cruz Mountains' vibrant logging industry.
